Since 2007, NIS conducts the Socio Economic survey annually. Previous surveys were undertaken in 1993/94, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2004, 2007, 2008 and 2009. The main objective of the CSES is to collect statistical information about living conditions of the Cambodian population and the extent of poverty.
